



<p>Animal Kingdom</p> <p>The Animal Kingdom is divided into nine major phylum. There are 800,000 different species across these phylum. Animals cannot make their own food.</p>	<p>Echinodermata</p> <p>The echinoderm has an external skeleton with spines. Usually the echinoderm has five arms. The spaces between these arms may be filled in. An echinoderm can replace an arm if it loses it.</p> <p>Greek: echino: spiky derma: skin</p>	<p>Nematoda</p> <p>The nematode is any worm-like animal that does not have segments or rings. This group includes roundworms and tapeworms.</p> <p>Greek: nema: threadlike</p>	<p>Arthropoda</p> <p>This is the largest group of animals. The arthropod has a body divided into three parts: a head, a thorax and an abdomen. Some have eight legs, some have six legs and others have more.</p> <p>Greek: arthron: joint pous: foot</p>
